The vision of Be Brave Ranch is to provide a safe and secure place of treatment and healing, aimed at the mind, body, heart and spirit of child victims and their families

Her clinical interests are in addressing the needs of complex child and family trauma and attachment, sexual abuse, and complex mental health and addictions. She has specialized training in the areas of evidence-based trauma treatment, Concurrent Addiction and Mental Health, developmental trauma and attachment, as well as FASD.
